He was also a loved and loving family man, with 9 grandchildren to visit and have fun with, and Ian was proud to be the 17th Chieftain of Camus-na-h-Erie.

But for those of us who saw him in the Gardens or chatted on the street, Ian was the one with the big smile, the cheery wave, the story to tell, the job to do. He was very much part of the Terraces family, and the large number who attended his moving funeral service last October is testament to that.

# 12 TRIANGLES ARRIVES ON EASTER ROAD

The artisan bakery 12 Triangles has opened a lovely new shop/café on Easter Road – a wonderful new addition to our neighbourhood.

12 Triangles is a scratch bakery, working entirely with cold/slow fermentation sourdoughs. Their breads and pastries work on a 3 or 4-day cycle and everything is made and shaped by hand by their bakers in East Lothian, using mostly local, seasonal and organic ingredients.

The name '12 triangles' was inspired by a Dylan Thomas poem (for those of you that were wondering!). With no additives or improvers used in their doughs, customers can enjoy Sourdough breads, both white and wholemeal varieties, as well as more unusual loaves like charcoal, Miche, sunflower and rosemary seed and a porridge loaf.

All their produce is really delicious! Of course if you just fancy a coffee then they offer a very nice brew too. Definitely worth a visit.

## ELECTRIC VEHICLES - CHARGING UPDATE

We have great news from our local EV charger group (and Francis in particular!). Despite COVID-19, the Council's installation plan is apparently still on track, with plans for a batch of 22kW chargers installed on Montgomery Street and a couple of larger 50 kW points by the bus garage over the next few

months. Both of these are within easy walking distance of the Terraces, and a few of the early adopters on the Terraces are finding a weekly charge is usually plenty. Please email us at *rrcta@live.co.uk* if you'd like to chat EV with a neighbour who's already made the switch.

## TRAFFIC ON THE TERRACES

While the volume of traffic along the Terraces may not yet be at pre-pandemic levels, it is certainly travelling as fast as ever. This is a major concern for many residents. The RRCTMA has continually lobbied for greater enforcement of the 20 mph speed limit and Royal Terrace was identified as one of the priorities in the New Town for police speed checks.

However, given restricted Police resources, this has led to only a handful of checks and therefore little impact on the speed of traffic along the Terraces. We will continue to push for more speed checks and are actively looking into ways of gathering speeding data ourselves and a means of alerting drivers to their speed. We are also seeking an improvement to the road markings at the junction with Carlton Terrace Brae to make the traffic priority clearer.

If you see a vehicle travelling at excessive speed or otherwise dangerously along the Terraces you can report the incident (with the car registration number) to the Police by calling 101. If you have further ideas to help reduce this issue please email us at rrcta@live.co.uk.
